ABC provides academic, enrichment, and wellness support for at-risk children in a safe and supportive environment.

ABC is seeking a part-time (9 hours/week: Monday, Tuesday, Thursday) Teacher for the ABC After School program in Victor.

Programming and Instruction

- Lead academic lessons, including literacy, math, art, STEM, wellness, PE, and other enrichment activities.
 - Prepare, plan, and teach curriculum in coordination with the lead teacher.
 - Dovetail with Teton School District literacy and math curriculum when possible.
- Provide supervision for students during snack and recess.
- Provide regular updates on students or academics to the lead teacher and/or ED when appropriate.
- Maintain a clean and organized classroom space and complete daily cleaning chores.
- Support program through various tasks as identified by the lead teacher or ED.

Safe and Supportive Environment

- Ensure compliance with Idaho Department of Health and Welfare child care center requirements.
- Utilize positive behavior strategies for student management.
- Have knowledge of behavior, academic, and medical needs of all students in the program.

Communication

- Provide connection between ABC and their families on a daily basis.
- Inform parents of any student concerns at drop off or pick up.

Volunteers

- Coordinate with the lead teacher to support volunteers by delegating tasks and responsibilities to volunteers.

Hours

- The position is for the 2023-24 After School program, which follows the TSD 401 district calendar.
- The After School program runs from 2:45-5:45pm. Teachers are expected to be there during that time frame, unless otherwise coordinated with the Executive Director.

Requirements

- Bi-lingual teachers are preferred, but not required (Spanish)
- Current Pediatric First Aid and CPR certification, or able to acquire one
- Department of Health and Welfare background check
- Early childhood or elementary education degree or 4 years of experience of working with children in a similar environment
- Maintain your Idaho RISE account through initial and annual training

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
